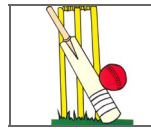

Disney In A Hurry Car 112 Update

esCarpade 2013 was sensational but before we could start we had to get to Bundaberg. The car purred like a kitten most of the way but decided to stall while turning at an intersection in Kingaroy. As we tried to get her going again we became aware of a crowd forming. The sight of a brightly coloured car with a bed on the roof stalled in the middle of their major intersection was quite a treat for them. We soon got her started and waved to the crowd as we headed off again for Bundaberg. First task when we arrived was getting the car scrutineered by the esCarpade safety team. She passed with flying colours and we had the rest of the day to relax and enjoy the sights. The morning of October 13 along with almost 60 other funny looking cars we left Bundaberg and headed for Dalby. From Dalby we drove to Lismore where some of the roads were extremely rough and steep in places. The car struggled to get up a couple of the hills and had to be towed to the top. We'd driven up roads steeper and rougher than these before without a problem so we were a little concerned but on the open road she drove beautifully. We left Lismore for Coffs Harbour where we were diverted because of the bush fires and had to travel the highway as a safety precaution. As we drove down the highway the car began to splutter every now and again and we decided we would get someone to look at her. We had our rest day in Coffs Harbour which was great. In between enjoying the weather, the beach and the sights we got a couple of guys from another team that were staying in the same motel to check the car over. They made a few adjustments and she was driving much better. The following morning we headed off for Muswellbrook. The car stalled on a few hills and we managed to get her going again but on Barrington Tops the car decided she wasn't going any further. As each of the other esCarpade vehicles drove past they all pulled over to have a look at the car and offer their diagnosis. The rough roads and the heat had taken their toll on many of the cars so the official mechanical vehicles were very busy. Eventually they got to our car but could not get her going and we had no other option but to load her onto the truck and carry her into Muswellbrook. The next morning the car was taken to a local mechanic who worked on her for most of the day. This is the first year we've experienced any mechanical problems with the car at all and it's obvious now that she'd been building up to a major breakdown. The first sign was stalling in Kingaroy, then not being able to make it up the hills on the way to Lismore, spluttering on the highway to Coffs and then stalling on the road to Muswellbrook. If you are ever in Muswellbrook and looking for a mechanic we can highly recommend 'Hollydene Garage'. We left Muswellbrook late in the afternoon and played dodge the kangaroos in the dark before arriving in Bathurst at about 11pm. The following day after driving the Bathurst Circuit we stopped at the Bradman Hall of Fame in Bowral for lunch before finishing at the WIN Stadium in Wollongong that afternoon. With esCarpade 2013 behind us we are now looking forward to 2014 and in the next edition we will be making an exciting announcement. We've had some wonderful support throughout 2013 and we'd like to thank Sharon from Walla Hair Salon, Kylie, Daryl and the team from Bean Here, David and the girls at Culcairn Pharmacy, the staff at WAW Walla, everyone from Second Hand Rose our wonderful sponsors Fitzie's Motors in Culcairn and the Joss Group in Albury.

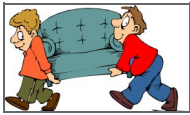
